

## **BEING YOURSELF**




I Don't Want Curly Hair- Laura Ellen Anderson




Everybody's Welcome- Patricia Hegarty and Greg Abbott


Perfectly Norman- Tom Percival

Oddbods- Steven Butler and Jarvis


Ava is a strange child.
